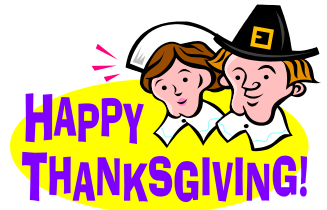
I post many photos of what we did in our classroom.

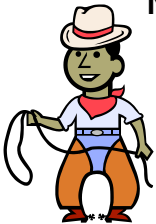

you have anything at home to help with our studies, please send it in. Be sure your child's name is on anything sent to school.

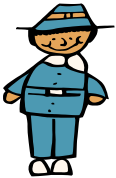
Letters of week is "l/i." Sight word is "play."

ENCOURAGE INDEPENDENCE: With the cold weather upon us it takes time to put on all the essentials such as coat, mittens, etc. Here at school I am encouraging independence by making the children dress themselves. By encouraging independence, the child's self-esteem and self-confidence are heightened. Please do the same at home. Practice zipping at home. MATH BENCH MARKS FOR NOVEMBER:

Number formation of numbers 0-10, working on 11-20. Number recognition 11-20 and number and color word recognition, shapes, composing and decomposing numbers to 10, tally marks, problem solving counting to 30, count back from 20.
